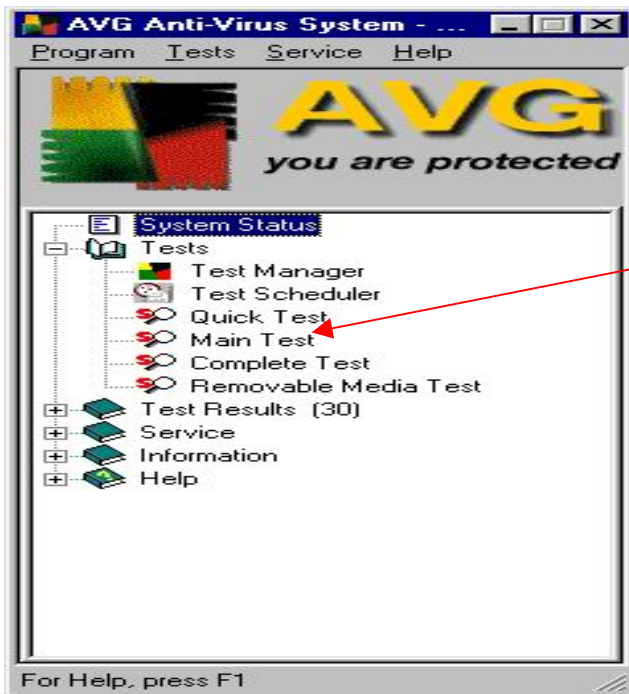
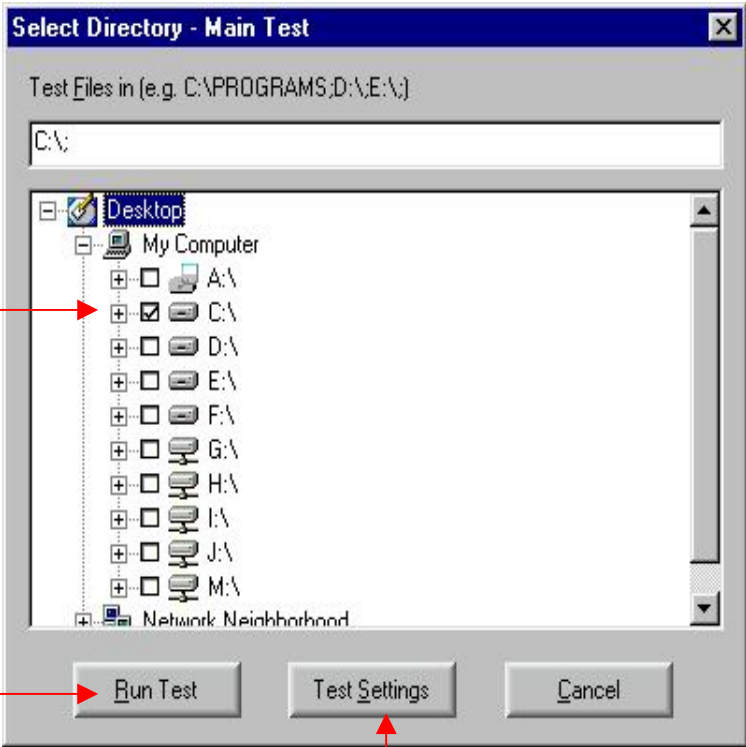


Start the AVG Anti-Virus program by double clicking AVG 6.0 shortcut on the desktop, or Start → Programs → AVG 6.0 Anti-Virus System → AVG 6.0 for Windows



Click on the **Main Test**

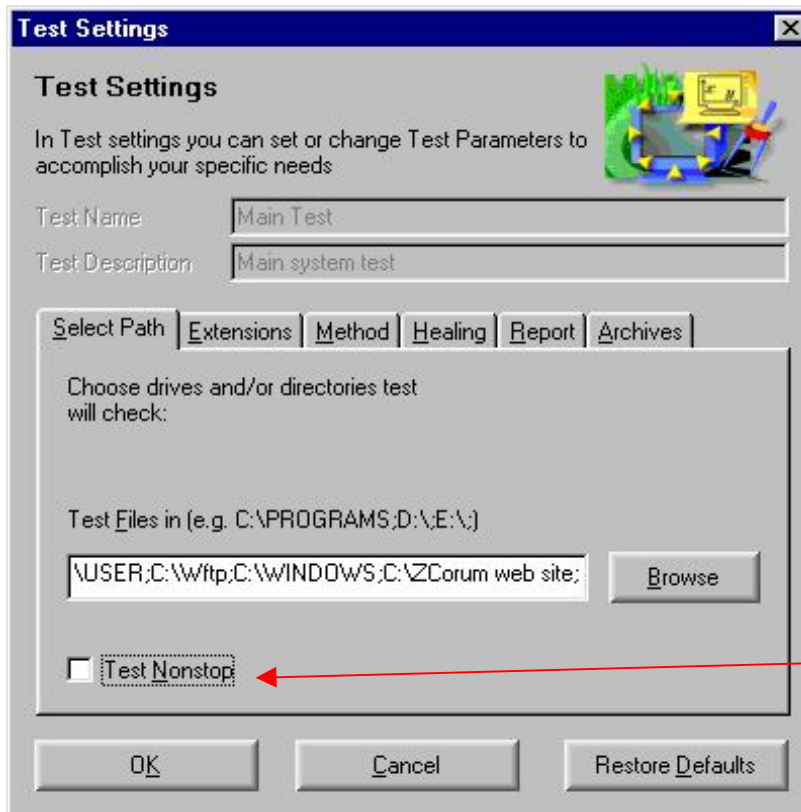
Check the folders you want to scan for virus. Here shown to scan the entire C drive.



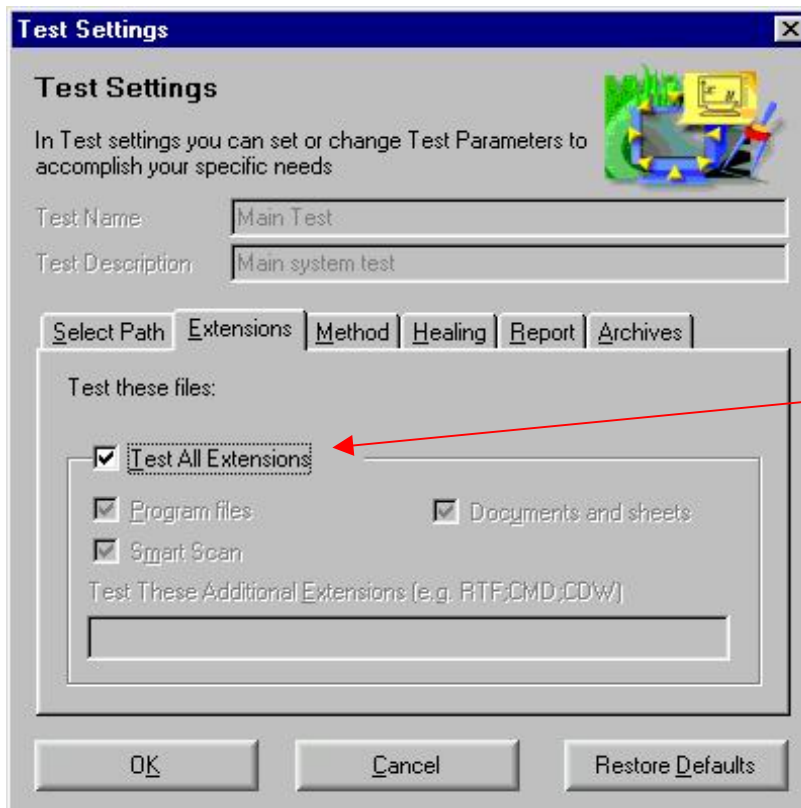
Click **Run Test** to start

You can define test settings, like what kind of files to scan, before you run it.

Here are some settings that you might consider to practice:



Check 'Test Nonstop' if you are not watching the progress, so it will continuously scan without asking you for actions if it finds virus



Scan all files

Once it finishes scan, it will pop up a Test Result window:

**Status**- determines the action taken by user in response to the virus infection and contains the following options:

- **Healed OK**- virus was removed by healing
- **Virus Vault**- infected file was deleted - moved to Virus Vault
- **Still Infected**- infected file is still on the drive in its unchanged -infected - form

Buttons: Heal, Remove, Delete file, Cancel, Detail Info, Print, Write to File, Select

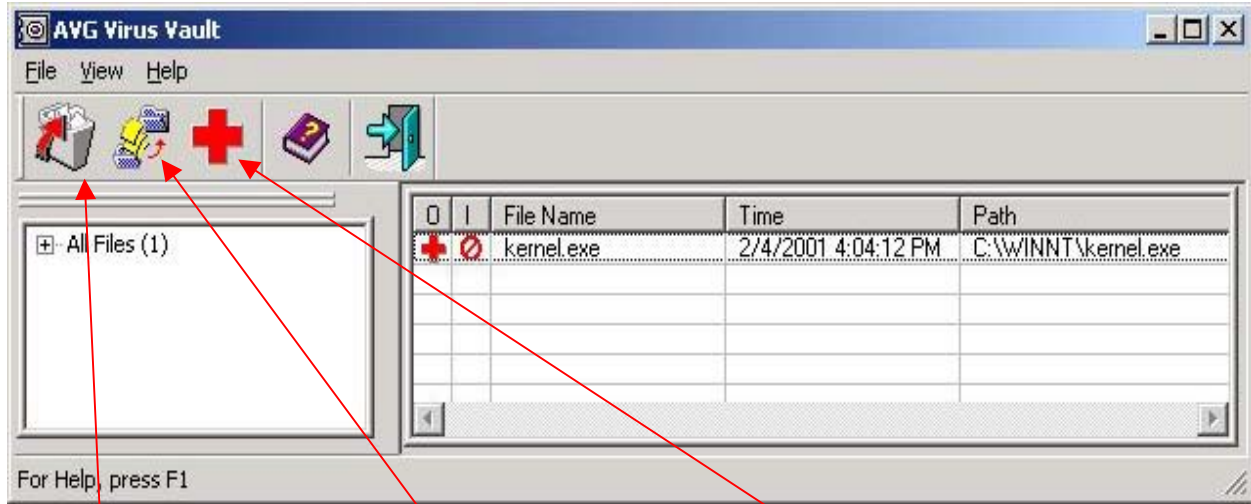
This tells you that no virus has been found.

The result shows the infected files and their status

It also informs you what files have not been checked yet

If you have set to Nonstop test, and it shows files 'Still Infected', then you will need to click on one of these three buttons to 'Heal', 'Remove', or 'Delete file'.

The infected files will be quarantined in the AVG Virus Vault.
